**HERE BE MONSTERS: FAMILY MAP-MAKING NIGHT**

**AGES**  
Children 6+ years  
Teens/teens  
Multigenerational

**PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**  
Introduce cartography by hosting an all-ages map-making event! Show maps of real and fictional worlds, then let participants create their own. You could have them map their bedrooms, houses, neighborhoods, or towns, or remake a map from a book or movie. Show old maps that depict sea monsters and ancient seas, and encourage map-makers to add their own fantastical elements to give them a historical nautical feel. See Resources for map elements, backdrops, and coloring sheets. Don't forget to discuss what a map key is and why it's important! A fun all-ages event. Suggested runtime: 60-90 minutes.

**Outcomes for teens:**

- Teens will become aware of the technologies and techniques used in map-making.
- If partnering with a local GIS professional or government agency, teens will be introduced to potential careers in map-making and other related fields.
- Teens will be able to articulate how artistic expression can be used in a practical way.
- Teens will practice communication skills by presenting their work to the group.

**TIP:**  
Local museums will likely have a number of maps in their collection (and many such map collections are digitized).

**ADAPTATION:**  
Focus on fictional elements of the event, such as the 60s sci-fi magazine *Amazing Stories*, the *Star Trek* Family Adventure, or *Cartoon Geographic*. The virtual language center the Next Children can make maps that depict these stories.

**ADAPTATIONS FOR TEENS:**

- For a pre-event event, teens could make map paper by tracing white paper it's like both and adding texture.
- Add a map-making component, map-building and create one grid to add to geography.
- Focus on map-making technology. Partner with a local GIS agency to introduce potential careers.

**WATER BOTTLE SEA CREATURES DESIGN CHALLENGE**

**AGES**  
Children 5+ years  
Teens

**PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**  
This is a contest you can run at the beginning of the summer re program, or make it a take-home component of any program of pollution or recycling. Each child receives a recycled plastic, with turn into a sea creature of their choosing. Prepare take-and-map that include various art supplies, or tell them they must use rec materials found around their homes to make their creature. Opt children could build dioramas as well. One week later, they return to the library to be displayed. You can have a committee judge them by age group, or let it be a people's choice award. Offer prizes such as reusable water bottles, and display the entries all summer for easy, ocean-themed décor!
