Art: Name Rocket

<u>Materials:</u>

- -Construction paper
- -3 red triangles
- -different colored rectangles
- -black paper
- -black marker
- -white crayon
- -star stickers



Steps:

- 1. Write each letter of your name or child's name on a separate cut out rectangle of construction paper. (ex. My name is Emily so I need 5 rectangles and will write a letter of my name on each rectangle).
- 2. Next get ready to assemble your rocket. You will need a black piece of paper, 3 red triangles, and your letter rectangles. Assemble your rocket on the paper.
- 3. Glue down all the pieces. Draw some stars or use some star stickers! Your rocket is now ready for take-off!
