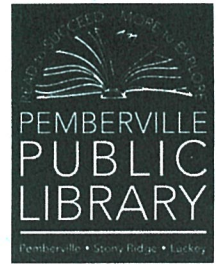


Shoot for the Stars Story time 2019

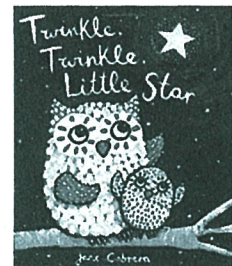
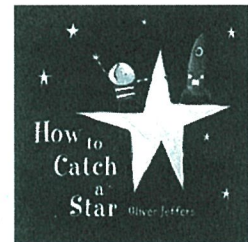

CRAFT: Stained glass foil stars or star bead necklaces

STAINED GLASS FOIL STARS

SUPPLIES: CEREAL BOX CARDBOARD, HOT GLUE, FOILSQUARES ,
GLUE STICKS SHARPIE MARKERS

1ST : Precut the cardboard into star shape

(I freehanded mine, Use Ellison machine if you have it)

2nd : Make the lines on the stars ahead of time with the glue gun
by just drawing various lines on the cardboard. To make several
shapes.

KIDS PART

3RD: have the kids rub glue stick all over the star shape In between
all the lines

4th: Place the foil sheet on top to glue down rubbing it to define all
the spaces . Fold the extra foil around the back of the star. Cut off
any excess foil the is not needed.

5th; Take the sharpie markers and start to color between all the
spaces using different colors to look like stained glass.

6th: Use some string or pipe cleaner to make a hanger and hang
your star.
